- Won the gold medal in doubles at the National Sports Festival in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
- 1986 Won the gold medal in doubles at the National Amateur Hard-Court Championship in Cleveland, Ohio.
- 1986 Won the gold medal in singles at the E.F. Hutton National Amateur Championships in Erie, Pennsylvania.

College

- 1986 #1 player for the University of South Florida
- 1987 #1 player for the University of South Florida
- Led USF to two Sun Belt Conference titles.

Professional

- 1988 After two years of college, he embarked on a pro tennis career, eventually becoming a doubles specialist. He would play until 2001. He earned \$749,587 in prize money.
- Career record: Singles - 4-8 ... highest ranking in the world: #167 on July 22, 1991; Doubles – 157-205 ... highest ranking: No. 32 on October 2, 1995.
- Only New Mexican to ever win a round in “singles” at a Grand Slam event- Australian Open 93. He played singles at Wimbledon in 1991 and 1993.
- Part of five doubles ATP titles and eight runners up.
- Grand Slam doubles results:
 - Australian Open ... lost in the third round in 1992 and 1996.
 - Wimbledon ... lost in the second round in 1993, 1994, and 1996.
 - U.S Open ... lost in the third round in 1994 and 1996.
- Grand Slam mix doubles results:
 - Australian Open ... lost in the second round in 1996.
 - Wimbledon ... lost in the third round in 1996.
- After 8 years on the ATP tour, he coached at two colleges and operated a tennis academy in Hawaii, Kazakhstan, and China.

- With doubles partner Geoff Grant, they produced a tennis documentary in 2004 entitled “The Journeyman”. This documentary was about Mark’s day-to-day life as an ATP touring professional. Recently, Mark produced another tennis documentary entitled “Journeyman 2”.
- Mark was labelled as “the worst player ever to beat Pete Sampras” But in 1991 at Queens Club (warm up tournament to Wimbledon) Mark, ranked #220 beat #8 ranked, Pete Sampras in a very hard-fought match. Quite an achievement to beat Pete Sampras back in the day.
- 1998 Played for the Idaho Sneakers, a tennis team in the World Team League.
- 2003 Volunteer assistant coach on the UCLA Bruin tennis staff.
- 2001-2020- Coached for 20 years in different locations around the world. Coached in Kazakhstan at a tennis Academy.
