MARCH 4, 1938 - JUNE 9, 2022

Donald Anthony Perkins is one of the greatest running back ever to play for the University of New Mexico Lobos and the Dallas Cowboys. Don played halfback and defensive back as a two-way player. player. He was a three-time All-Skyline selection. In 1959 he received third-team All-American honors. Don played 8 seasons for the Cowboys. He was the 1961 NFL Rookie of the Year; 3 times All-Pro; 6 times Pro Bowl; and member of the Dallas Cowboys Ring of Honor. His 442 jersey is retired by UNM Lobos.

MAY 29, 1939 - DECEMBER 9, 2021

Affred 'Sig At' Unser won the Indianapolis 500-Wile Race four times (1970, 1971, 1978, 1987). He won the National Auto Racing Championship in 1970, 1983, and 1985. Unser competed in USAC's Stock Car division in 1967, and was the series Rookie of the Year. Unser has led the second most laps of any driver in the history of the Indianapolis 500, at 644. He was inducted into the Indianapolis Motor Soeedway Hall of Fame in 1986: International Motorsports Hall of Fame in 1998: Motorsports Hall of Fame of America in 1991.





BILL GRACEY

For over 40 years, Bill Gracey has been and continues to be coach, mentor and an inspiration to countless young men and women in New Mexico who learn from him valuable skills and respect for the games they play,

Many of these were granted college scholarships. Some became coaches themselves. James Yodice became a respected sportswriter. James Buccheri, Scott Gracey, Chad Kuhn, Scott Jaster, John Roskos, Sam Smith, Mike Vento, Kyle Weiland played professional baseball.

Just as important are numerous individuals whose lives benefit from lessons of teamwork, discipline and perseverance taught by Gracey who is equally enthusiastic in promoting athletic opportunities for young people regardless of age or gender. Just ask Maya Pacheco currently playing Varsity Softball at Cleveland High School and being offered College scholarships.

A talented athlete himself, Gracey was named to All-State, All-District, All-City High School teams in Baseball and Football and was West Mesa's Outstanding Senior Athlete of the Year (1970-71)

Gracey coached Boys' Baseball at West Mesa, Cibola, and La Cueva High Schools and Club Baseball in New Mexico. Overall, his coaching record boasts eight State Championships.

With Gracey as Assistant Coach, Lobo Women's Softball achieved a 4 year record of 127-84.

The "Bill Gracey MVP Baseball Player Award" created in his honor is awarded annually to the outstanding player at Cibola High School.

Gracey was inducted into the Cibola High School Athletics Hall of Fame in 2014 and into the New Mexico Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2020.

Gracey served as a Division 1 NCAA Men's Basketball Official for 31 years. He officiated 14 NCAA DI Tournament Games (I game away from Final Four twice); NCAA DII National Championship Game (1987); New Mexico Championship Games (1982, 1985)

In 2015, Gracey was appointed Associate Supervisor of Officials for The West Coast Consortium that includes PAC Twelve, Mountain West, Western

Athletic, Big West, Big Sky, and West Coast Conferences and he continues in that role today.

His knowledge of college baseball motivated the Mountain West Conference to seek his sevices in the evaluation of baseball umpire performance.

Sports is a family affair at the Graceys—Wife of 38 years, Kris played Collegiate Volleyball., daughter Lauren played Varsity and Club Volleyball, son, Scott played on two La Cueva State Baseball Championship teams, was a Lobo shortstop and played for the Toronto Blue Jays Organization.. Bill continues his coaching career as an Assistant Baseball Coach for the La Cueva Bears

LOU PIEROTTI

Born 1920 in Colorado; Lou ran track, played baseball, and made men's softball teams as a teen. His WW-II service provided him with opportunities to compete in worldwide competition as boxer, miler, and baseball. Offered professional baseball contracts while in the military, played fast pitch softball in 5 World Tournaments.

In local, state, and national bowling tournaments; he won league championships, state honors for 25 years, with a 185 average, low grosse series over 600, state 9 game series 1813, many trophies for closing 30 frames.


At 40, Lou took up golf, winning many local and statewide men's championship flight golf tournaments, won four Northern NM Senior tournaments in a row, two State Championships, and competed in two National Tournaments. Founded the NNMSGA; served as the associations' first president providing sanctioned tournaments for NNM golfers.

During 70 years of sports competition, Lou was prominently featured in the news, year round, throughout New Mexico. Starting at 3rd base and player coach for the S-Site, State Championship Fast Pitch softball team, with pitcher Bun Ryan, the team won a regional tournament and competed in another world tournament.

The success and lasting honors Lou and team members received began in 1953 with Lou's creation of the Pierotti's Clowns, dubbed "The Goodwill Ambassadors of Los Alamos". The only 5 man Softball Team in the world. Lou managed, became the Clown Prince of Softball, and anchored third base from 1952 to 1977 with a record of 177 wins and 23 loses competing against quality 9 man teams. The Pierotti's Clowns provided an exceptional world class softball experience, together with circus like entertainment for families in the Atomic City, NM, for charity and love of the game. Played the Albuquerque Dukes AAA Baseball team 3 times, with 2 sets of bases, and never lost to any professional team.

- Featured in six national magazines, including the first issue of Sports Illustrated in 1954.
- Inducted into the New Mexico ASA Softball Hall of Fame in Las Cruces.
- 1999; Lou received the coveted "Living Treasure of Los Alamos"
- Sports, Business success and Community Service, with wife Lena, were honored by Los Alamos as Heroes of the Cold War for their life's work.




HERB STINSON

Coach Herb Stinson graduated from Aztec High School in 1970, where he was a member of the National Honor Society, FTA, marching band, served as Senior Class President and lettered in football, wrestling and track. In 1969, he played right guard on the State Runners-up football team under Coach Marty Steffan, earning All County and All State honors. In wrestling, he qualified for state three times, placing twice, and the team placed 3rd in State in 1969. It was during Herb's sophomore year that he decided to become a teacher and coach, inspired by the example set by his coach, Jerry Parker.


In 1970, Herb attended Dixie State College and coached wrestling at Dixie High School. He wrestled at the YMCA in Las Vegas, NV under legendary coach, Jerry Wager, winning the Nevada Freestyle Open and representing them in an AAU international tournament, placing 5th in Greco. In 1971 after receiving a wrestling scholarship, he transferred to SUSC now known as Southern Utah University. He was a two-time RMAC Regional place winner under Coach Joe Lapour, graduating in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in social science and PE. He was inducted into the SUU Coaching Hall of Fame in 2001.

After returning to NM, Herb was hired in Aztec in 1976 where he taught and coached football, wrestling and baseball for 24 years. He led the Tigers to 12 wrestling State Championships, 11 of them in a row. He was the NM Coach of the Year seven times, National Coach of the Year three times and inducted into the NHSCA Hall of Fame in 2016. He retired in 2000 and then taught and coached in Bayfield, CO for the next 12 years, returning to Aztec in 2012 where he still coaches wrestling. As of 2022, he has helped the team win five more State Championships. To date and counting, he has coached 69 individual State Champions and 19 All Americans. Coach Stinson is known for saying "Winning is a state of mind. What state of mind do you have?"

Coach Stinson and his wife, Terry, reside in Aztec, NM. He has three grown children, five grandchildren, three great-grandchildren and a goddaughter.



Gene Torres September 9, 1937 - June 12, 2005

Gene Torres was born in Trinidad, Colorado on September 9, 1937. At the early age of 10, Gene was introduced to what would be his lifetime passion, the game of golf. With humble beginnings, he earned his way onto the golf course by shoveling coal into the local furnace at the Trinidad Golf Course. It would become a steppingstone to earning the position of a golf caddy. From there he made friendships that would last a lifetime and nurture his love of the game.

Those friendships eventually led him into playing tournaments and a golf career that expanded more than 57 years. In 1956, Gene went onto win the Colorado State High School Golf Championship. From 1962-2005, Gene was the Head Golf Professional and Professor at New Mexico Highlands University in Las Vegas, New Mexico, where he mentored several college golfers. Because of his inspiration, many would continue in his footsteps and become Class A PGA Golf Professionals themselves. This accomplishment brought joy to Gene as he too was a Class A PGA Golf Professional since 1970. Later, Gene would win more than 80 Professional Golf Tournaments throughout the United States and Mexico. He won 5 New Mexico Open Golf Tournaments. Four were in a row from 1968, 1969, 1970, and 1971. His 5th New Mexico Open was in 1984. In 1971 in Pinehurst, North Carolina, he won the National Pro-Am Golf Tournament at the Famed Pinehurst #1 Golf Course. He posted a new course record on the last day of 62. This victory earned him a 1972 Lincoln Continental car. In 2004, the Professional Golfers Association of America awarded Gene the Lifetime Achievement Award. It is one of the highest honors you could receive from the PGA of America.

In 2004, Gene was also inducted into the New Mexico Highlands University Hall of Honor. Lastly, in 2005 with family, friends and community members by his side, New Mexico Highlands University, in his honor, renamed and dedicated their golf course the Gene Torres New Mexico Highlands University Golf Course.

Luke Wysong was an outstanding student/athlete for Cleveland High School. Luke accomplished a rare feat by being award the Gatorade Football and Track Athlete of the year.


In an abbreviated season due to covid restrictions, Luke led Cleveland to a 4-0 record and a 6A State Championship vs. Las Cruces High School. A 2019 All-State selection, he concluded his prep football career with 1,173 receiving yards and fourteen touchdowns.

In track, the 5'10", 185-pound senior won the 100- and 200-meter dashes, took second in the long jump and 400-meter race, and shared in a 5A-record relay clocking to help the Storm win the state team title.

A Rio Rancho Fire Department and Police Department Youth Volunteer, Luke has donated his time locally as part of food donation drives and has volunteered on behalf of multiple community service initiatives through his church youth group.

In the classroom he maintained a 3.24GPA.

Luke committed and played this past season for the University of New Mexico Lobos where he caught twenty-four passes for 224 yards or an average of 9.8 yards. Already a fan favorite, UNM Head Coach Danny Gonzales is referring to Luke as his "playmaking sophomore."





RYLEE GRANDALL

ARTESIA HIGH SCHOOL







RyLee Crandall was a top pitcher and hitter for the Artesia Bulldogs softball team for 5 years. In 2021, she was named 2021 Gatorade's New Mexico Softball Play of the year, the New Mexico High School Association All-Star Team, and the Max Preps Softball All-American Second team.

Following in her sister's footsteps, Kali Crandall who was voted Gatorade's NM Softball Play of the year in 2017-2018, RyLee developed her skills early on. Also contributing to RyLee's success on the field was her father who coached both daughters.

Amongst RyLee's many achievements, she ended her high school career with the second best in the state with 667 strikeouts. Since an 8th grader, she won 56 games as a pitcher, which ranks her fourth all-time. She was instrumental the three state championships – 2021, 2019 and 2018 for the Bulldogs

Off the field, RyLee maintained a 4.24GPA in school, was elected to her high school's Student Council, and volunteered in numerous community service initiatives in association with her church youth group.

RyLee committed to Baylor University where she is already preparing for her first collegiate season.







MISTY LONG CARLSBAD HIGH SCHOOL







Misty Long is a 1993 graduate of Carlsbad, where she played goalkeeper for the Cavegirls. But the last few years have been special. In 2019, the team got past the quarterfinals of the state playoffs for the first time. In the spring of 2021, the Cavegirls won the 2020-21 6A state title after the season moved due to the COVID pandemic. Later in the year, the Cavegirls finished second for the 2021 State Girls' Soccer Championship.

Long played collegiately for the University of Evansville graduating there in 1997. At Evansville, as a sophomore she earned 2nd Team All-Conference honors and as a senior was a first team Missouri Valley All-Conference selection.

Prior to assuming the reins of the Cavegirls program in 2008 she spent six years as a coach for the University of Wyoming.

As the Cavegirls head coach she has won over two hundred games, nine District titles, a 2020 state championship, and a runner-up finish in 2021.

Under Coach Long's leadership, the Cavegirls soccer program has become the dominant program in the entire state.
