Four years ago, Theo walked into my office to visit about me doing 16x20 canvas posters of New Mexico sports heroes for the Elegante Hotel's sports bar that he was managing.

He talked about being previously involved with UNM Lobo Club and recently with Boise State University Athletic Booster Club. I told him about the New Mexico Sports Hall of Fame.

When he left my office, he asked to become a Hall of Fame board member. I was looking for a business owner that has a passion for sports and ability to help raise money for the Hall of Fame charitable causes. I found a great board member. He stepped in and went to work on Board activities.



A defining characteristic of Theo's was passion. He was passionate about causes, about work about music, sports, people, and animals. Mostly he was passionate about his family. Theo was born to be a hospitality leader.

He started as a bellman at the Holiday Inn Midtown here in Albuquerque at the age of 17. He didn't stay a bellman long, quickly rising through the ranks learning all he could about the ins and outs of hotels. During the summers while in college, he worked as a door-to-door salesperson selling bibles. The skills he learned during those summers of entrepreneur and communication would help with his future successes.

After graduating from the University of New Mexico, he moved to Los Angeles to be an actor. He worked briefly at Universal Studios. He got a big break landing a job at the Beverly Hill Hilton. His passion for sports led him to serve on the planning committee for the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

Theo would manage various hotels across the country. Finally in 2000, Theo would join his brother, Walter at Peak Hospitality and become the CEO and President.

Theo was an athlete at Menual School playing football and basketball. He tried out for the UNM basketball team but had his foot broken in practice by UNM's first seven-footer. When he could not play basketball anymore, next best thing ... watch the Lobos play, which up until his death.


His newest sports passion led him to the New Mexico Sports Hall of Fame. Yes, he learned the ins and outs of the Hall Fame, which led him to become the Board President in 2021 until the present. He loved the history of New Mexico athletics, interacting with the inductees and annual award winners; and bring new partner companies to help make the Charity Golf Classic and Induction Banquet special and first class. CELEBRATION OF LIFE Russell "Rusty" Mitchell June 1, 1942 ~ February 25, 2023

by Frank Mercogliano ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — Rusty Mitchell, who coached men's gymnastics at The University of New Mexico from 1966-99,

Mitchell was named to the Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame in 1991 and to the UNM Alumni Lettermen's Hall of Honor in 1995. He was inducted in the Southern Illinois Saluki Hall of Fame in 1964 and the National Gymnastics Hall of Fame in 1985 as well.

Mitchell was the dean of coaches at UNM when men's gymnastics was dropped as a sponsored sport. He left coaching with a record of 243-98 (a .713 winning percentage) before moving over to the health and P.E. department, serving as an assistant professor. Overall, Mitchell's Lobos won 11 Western Athletic Conference championships out of a possible 18, and he produced 16 NCAA individual champions and 53 All-Americans.



The Lobos finished in the Top-12 nationally in 23 seasons, and the Lobos were represented at the NCAA Championships, either via the team or via individuals, in every season from 1967 to 1999. Twice the Lobos achieved No. 1 rankings. The team was ranked No. 1 for 11 of the 12 weeks in the 1995 season, and the team also rose to the top of the polls in 1996.

Mitchell was also well respected as a gymnastics coach away from UNM, as he served as a coach on the Olympic stage as well. He was twice selected as Assistant Coach for the U.S. Olympic Men's Gymnastic Team, Mexico City, (1968) & Munich, Germany, (1972). He was also selected Assistant Coach for the U.S. Team at the World University Games, Moscow, USSR, (1973) and Chief of Mission for the Men's World Championships Gymnastic Team, Varna, Bulgaria, (1974). He also served on the U.S. Olympic Committee, the National Association of College Gymnastics Coaches, the National High School Rules Committee, the National Collegiate Sport Council, and was a representative to the USGF Board of Directors and their men's Program Committee.

Mitchell earned a bachelor's at Southern Illinois in 1964 and then his master's in 1966 from there as well. At Southern Illinois he captained the men's gymnastics team from 1962-64 and he was named "Most Outstanding Gymnast". He was a 10-time All American at SIU and the Salukis won one NCAA team title and finished second twice while going undefeated in dual meet competitions.

He went on to compete for the United States in the 1964 Olympic Games in Tokyo, where he became the first athlete to successfully perform a double back. In all, Mitchell competed in eight events in the 1964 Olympics.



DANNY VILANUEVA

Daniel "Danny" Dario Villanueva

Daniel was born to migrant missionary workers in Tucumcari, New Mexico. He was the ninth of twelve children. His life was a "rag to riches" story.

Danny was one of the NFL's first Latino kickers and a pioneer of Spanish-language television. Danny played in 110 games over eight seasons in the NFL. He co-founded Univision network and become one of the wealthiest Latino executives in the country.

Danny played football for New Mexico A&M, now as New Mexico State in 1958 and 1959. He was part of the teams that won back-to-back Sun Bowl games and well as going undefeated in his senior year.

The Los Angeles would visit Las Cruces to evaluate Danny's teammate, Pervis Atkins and saw him kicking. Pervis, 2009 NMSHOF inductee, who was drafted by the Rams. Danny would sign with the Rams and do both punting and placekicking, which is rare in the NFL. Nicknamed "El Kickador," whenever he walked onto the field, they would play bullfighting music.


He earned \$5500 for the year kicking for the Rams. To boost his income, he worked as a sportscaster at KMEX, a small Spanish station.


1962, he led the NFL in punting and set a team record by kicking a 51-yard field goal.

In 1965, Danny was traded to the Dallas Cowboys for Tommy McDonald and his pay increased to \$15,000. Tommy, a Highland High School graduate, was later inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame and a 1980 Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame inductee. Danny last game ended up being the championship game against the Green Bay Packers in the famous Ice Bowl at Lambeau Field in 1967.

After two years with the Cowboys, where he set the record for the most extra points kicks made without a miss (56), he retired and became the new director of KMEX in Los Angeles.

The station became the springboard of his eventual media empire. Danny bought stakes in other TVC stations and KMEX became the flagship of the Spanish International Communication Corp, which eventually became Univision network in 1988.

JENNIFER POYER

In 2012, Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) retired her basketball and volleyball jersey numbers, making her the most decorated athlete in school history.

Jennifer Goble Poyer, born in Denver, Colorado developed a passion for sports in middle school and she went on to star in several sports at John Marshall High School in San Antonio, Texas. At Marshall, she received all-district honors in basketball, volleyball, and track & field, including holding the school record for the shot put. She also was named the 1990 Greater San Antonio Player of the Year for Girls Basketball.

Jennifer came to Eastern New Mexico University in the fall of 1990 and immediately starred on the basketball court. Jennifer was twice the LSC player Co-Player of the Year and the LSC Freshmen of the Year. She was a four-time All-LSC pick, leaving ENMU as the all-time scoring leader with 1,852 points. Jennifer also left ENMU as the top per-game scoring average for a season (23.9 in 91-92) and a career (20.4). Jennifer led the Zia's to a regular season LSC basketball title and their best-ever record (23-5) in 92-93.

In Volleyball, Jennifer was a four-time first-team All-Lone Star Conference (LSC) pick, being named the LSC player or co-player of the year all four years. She finished her career with several ENMU and LSC volleyball records and lead ENMU to their best-ever volleyball record (33-6) in 1993 en route to the LSC regular season and tournament titles. Jennifer was also named the Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame Athlete of the year in 1993 and voted as the Greatest Zia in all four years she played.


In 1999 Jennifer was named a member of ENMU's All-Century and All-Decade (1990s) volleyball teams, and in 2000, she was inducted into Eastern New Mexico University's Athletics Hall of Honor. In 2011, Jennifer was elected to the Lone Star Conference Hall of Honor, and


Jennifer has continued to give back to her Alma Mater, spending many years working at ENMU including, ENMU Athletics from 1998-2000, the Office of Communication Services from 2001-2005 and from 2013-2022, and serving on the ENMU Professional Senate, the Greyhound Club Board of Directors, the ENMU Alumni Association Board of Directors. Her husband, Inosia "Sia" Poyer, is currently the head volleyball coach at ENMU; she has three children, of which the older two will be attending ENMU this fall.

Cheryl Johnson ... "I've wanted to be a teacher and coach since fourth grade. I've just thought it would be fun."

Cheryl spent 31 years in APS education as a physical education teacher, volleyball, basketball, and softball coach, assistant principal, principal, and athletic director. Cheryl's integrity, demeanor, enthusiasm, and classy example of how you coach and react in the heat of competition set her apart from so many others.

"She is cool under pressure and she's a winner." Longtime Mustang baseball coach, Tim McCorkle said when Cheryl was named the Athletic Director at West Mesa High School

She is best known as a softball coach, taking her teams five times to the state finals at three different schools, West Mesa High School, La Cueva High School, and Volcano Vista High School. She won state softball titles in 2005 with Las Cueva High School and at Volcano Vista in 2011 and 2012. During the 2011 and 2012 season the Hawks had a state best fifty-two game winning streak.

Cheryl, a Manzano High School graduate in 1976, was a three-year letterman in volleyball, basketball, and softball. The Monarchs won state volleyball in 1975 and were the softball state runner-up in 1976.

She attended New Mexico State on a scholarship to play softball. In 1978, she transferred to University of New Mexico to play on the school's first softball team. The softball team went to the NAIA National's Sweet 16 in 1979. Softball was not a sport in the NCAA. She earned a golden glove at second base and was one of the best hitters ever for UNM, still ranks fourth in a career (10) and fifth in a season (6) for triples.

After graduating, she played for 10 years in the city softball leagues and won a state title.

Her first coaching job was in 1979-1980 as an assistant coach in volleyball, basketball, softball for Sandia High School Coach Ann "Weegie" Poston. One year later, she became the head basketball coach for West Mesa High School.

From 1990 to 1993, she coached the West Mesa softball team to four district championships. Those teams placed in State fourth, third and two runners-up.

Cheryl went into Albuquerque Public School administration from 1993-2001. She returned to teaching and coaching softball from 2002 until 2007.


Cheryl also excelled in racquetball, playing in the state age group com-

Cindy "Pecos" Roybal was born in Pecos, NM. From an early age, Cindy has always been a fierce competitor. She had dreams of winning a state high school basketball title, playing in the Olympics and professionally, like boys.

Unfortunately, there were no sanctioned girls' teams at the various levels. Cindy decided to change that with a sit-down strike at Pecos High School to start a girls' team or to allow her to play on the boys' team.

Her senior year, Cindy would go to New Mexico Highlands to watch a game at the Stu Clark Gym that the All-American Red Heads were playing. The Red Heads, a professional all women's all-star team, played full court against men's teams and existed from 1936 to 1986. After this game, her life would never be the same. She asked to try out for the team. The owner, Orwell Moore invited Cindy to Camp Courage in Caraway, Arkansas for the tryout. She made the team. They played 228 games over thirty-two states from 1971-1972. One year was enough and decided to become a coach.

In 2012 Cindy, as a member of the Red Heads organization, were inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Cindy went on to attend the College of Santa Fe where she competed in the Women's Recreation Association in basketball, volleyball, and tennis. In 1981, Cindy received her master's degree in physical education from NM Highlands University.

She started her teaching and coaching career in 1975 at SF St. Catherine's High School where she was the PE Department Head, cheerleader sponsor, intramural director, and head coach for girls' basketball, volleyball, softball, and track. She then went on to the Institute of American Indian Arts for one year as a PE teacher and head basketball and volleyball coach. From 1979-1985 Cindy was at SF Indian School and taught PE and coached basketball, volleyball, and softball, was the PE Dept. Head and Interim Athletic Director.

From 1985 to 2002, Cindy became a college professor and coached basketball and volleyball at NM Highlands University. She was the only Hispanic female Athletic Director in the nation from 2000-2002. Her basketball teams won the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) in 1992, 1994, and 2000. Her teams posted over 250 wins and they posted a winning record for twelve seasons in a row. She was named RMAC Coach of the Year in 1992.

In 2002, Cindy returned to high school basketball for three years at Pojoaque Valley High School. She then went back to Santa Fe Indian School from 2009-2013 where she won back-to-back AAA State Basketball Championships in 2010 and 2011 and her team was the State runner-up in 2012, losing by one point in the final. In 2014, she went to Espanola for four years where her basketball teams were 5A State Semi-Finalists for three years straight in 2015, 2016, and 2017. Her overall High School Basketball record is 377-105.

Cindy will return to coaching as the head girls basketball coach at Pojoaque High School for the upcoming 2023-2024. Her sports journey continues ...



TY MURRAY

"King of the Cowboys" \dots Eight seconds of glory \dots "I wanted to win every time."

When Ty was in the fifth grade, his teacher asked the students to write down the answer to this question, "If you could do anything in your life, what would it be? Ty wrote, "I want to break Larry Mahan's record."

Ty was born in Glendale, Arizona in 1969 to rodeo parents, Harold "Butch" and Joy Murray. While still in diapers, baby Ty was climbing atop his mother's sewing machine case, riding it like a bucking bull. Butch stated "Ty was driven at an early age ... he worked daily with the mindset that he was going to be a world champion."

Before long, he was winning peewee events, and his special talent caught the eye of Larry Mahan, at the time the greatest living rodeo legend. The six-time champion invited young Ty to spend a summer on his ranch in Duffy, Colorado learning rodeo and life lessons, which prepared Murray for a career that would surpass even Mahan's.

Murray won seven all-around titles by competing in bull riding, saddle bronc riding, and bareback riding during a record-setting career.

His connections to New Mexico run deep, his father was the starter at Ruidoso Downs Horse Racetrack in 1969. The family would spend at least ten months in New Mexico and spend the winter in Arizona. In 1974, the family moved to Pena Blanca, New Mexico so his father could be the starter at the new horse racetrack in Santa Fe. Ty would go to school in Arizona and spend the rest of the time in New Mexico.

In 1987, he won the National High School Rodeo Association all-around championship. In 1989, Ty was the all-around national champion leading Odessa College men's team to the College National Finals Rodeo Championship.

With his parents living in Sandia Park, New Mexico. Ty decided to host The Ty Murray Invitational PBR bull riding in Albuquerque in 1996. The highly anticipated annual event moved to the Pit in 2009, regularly playing to sell-out crowds.

Ty was the co-founder of the Professional Bull Riders (PBR). He was inducted into the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame in 2000 and the PBR Ring of Honor in 2002. He has worked as a commentator for CBS on PBR broadcasts since 2007. In 2020, PBR created the Ty Murray Top Hand Award given annually to a rodeo athlete of significant distinction and impact.

Ty continues to be an exceptional ambassador of the sport and the cowboy lifestyle. Ty is a co-founder of National Day of the Horse, which allows us to reflect and be thankful for the role horses play in our lives and society."

HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS' COACH OF THE YEAR



LISA VILLAREAL VOLGANO VISTA HIGH SSCHOOL







Lisa Villareal, known as Coach "V" led the Volcano Vista Hawks Girls Basketball team to back-to-back 5A State Girls. Basketball State Championships in 2022 going undefeated 29-0. It was the fourth straight state championship appearance for the Hawks. The Hawks were the 27th team to go undefeated since 1973.


The Hawks went on a 46-game winning streak over three seasons that ended December 6, 2022. This winning streak ranks ninth all-time in state history.

Lisa has been coaching girls' basketball for 19 years with 17 winning seasons. Her teams have made every state tournament. In addition to the 2021 and 2022 state titles, Her Hawks teams won in 2012, 2014, and 2016.

Coach "V" has been the only girls' basketball coach at Volcano Vista since the school opened in 2007. Her record is 307-111 at Volcano Vista and 378-129 overall.

Lisa had coaching stints at Espanola Valley High School (2001-2003) and Capital High School (2005-2007). She took off two years of coaching to earn her master's degree in technology in Education in 2005.

For the last 10 years, Coach "V" and her Hawks have hosted their annual color game. They raise money for families, or non-profit organizations, while bringing awareness to such causes as child abuse, mental health, pancreatic cancer, leukemia in children, and MSA (Multiple System Atrophy). The Lady Hawks will continue to bring awareness to causes that hit close to home.





HIGH SCHOOL BOYS' COACH OF THE YEAR



CREC BROWN VOLCANO VISTA HIGH SSCHOOL







Greg Brown led the Volcano Vista High School Hawks to a 29-0 record in the 2021-2022 season. It was only the 19th team to go undefeated in the 100-year history of New Mexico High School boys' basketball. It was the first Albuquerque Public School to have an undefeated season.

His Hawks won an epic 5A state championship in overtime against Las Cruces High School 66-55. It was only the second time in state championship history that two teams entered the game undefeated.

This was the school's second state title and Brown's third state championship, the other one was at Manzano High School in 2006.

What made the 2022 state tournament even more special for Greg was that his son, Hudson, a freshman, was on the team. Also, his daughter, Kennedy helped the girls' Hawks team go undefeated and win the 5A Girls' State Basketball Championship. It was the first time that a boys and girls' team from the large class went undefeated in the same season.

Greg and his Hawks dedicated the season to his father and 2018 New Mexico Sports Hall of Fame inductee, Mike Brown, who passed away on June 30, 2021. After an illustrious career at the Albuquerque Academy, Mike was Greg's assistant coach for three years. Greg played for his father on three Albuquerque Academy state championship teams in 1989, 1990, and 1991.

Greg has been the coach of the Hawks since the school opened in 2007. His record is 256-142 at Volcano Vista and 352-181 overall. Prior to Volcano Vista, Greg coached at Manzano High School from 2002-2007. He has also led his teams to six District Championships and two Metro Championships.

The Hawks followed up that season in 2022-23 with a back-to-back state championship, going 29-1 on the season. During the last two seasons, his teams went on a 47-game winning streak, which ranks third all-time.

The 5'2" senior Midfielder was instrumental in leading the Hope Christian School to a 23-0-0 record and a 4A State Championship. It was the 10th undefeated in girls' soccer history,

The Huskies beat St. Pius 5-0 in the State Championship game. Ashlyn scored a goal in the Championship game. This was a back-to-back state championship for the Huskies. It was the third straight state championship appearance.

The Huskies, one of the smallest 4A with 365 students defeated 2-0 the 5A state champion, Eldorado High School, a 2000+students' high school. Thus, Hope Christian was the best girls' team in the state of New Mexico, and Ashlyn played the most significant role on the team.

During her senior season she scored 47 goals, had 21 assists, and scored 115 points. While Ashlyn's stats speak for themself, what is even more impressive is that she played midfielder, but when needed would play defense for the Huskies due to injuries of other teammates or needing to protect a lead in a game.

In her last three years, Ashlyn earned First Team All-State and First Team All-Metro honors. She was selected as an All-American.

Ashlyn will be playing soccer for the Ft. Lewis College Skyhawks in the Fall.

As a senior, Ja'Kwon Hill, a 6-foot-2 guard led the Volcano Vista Hawks to a 29-0 record and the 5A state champion-ship. Hill averaged 18.1 points, 6 rebounds and five assists per game. Hill, a 4-year varsity player shot 61 percent from conventional field goal range, 45 percent from beyond the arc and 83 percent at the free throw line for the 2021-2022 season.

In the 2022 5A state championship game, Hill scored 17 points, 7 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals in Volcano Vista's 66-55 overtime win against No. 1 Las Cruces. He was clutch down the stretch including hitting two free throws with four seconds remaining to send the game to overtime.

Hill was the 2022 Gatorade New Mexico Boys Basketball Player of the Year, first player chosen from Volcano Vista High School. He was the Metro Player of the Year. Named First Team All-State and All-Metro for two years.

Hill maintained a 4.01 weighted GPA his senior year. Ja'Kwon accepted an offer from New Mexico Highlands University, where he averaged 2.4 points, 1.2 assists, .9 rebounds and .3 steals a game in his freshman season.
