Bachelor's degree from UNM was in Physical Education. Finished in December 1967 but graduation was in May 1968. I missed because I was in the NM National Guard for basic and advanced training at Ft. Bliss, <u>Texas</u> Master's degree from UNM in 1973 was in Physical Education with a concentration in Exercise Physiology and a minor in Guidance and Counseling.

- Ran track and cross country for the Albuquerque High School (AHS) Bulldogs and lettered in both sports for three years.
- 1962 Set the AHS's school record in the 880-yard race, which it still stands at AHS.
- 1962 Won the Class A Cross Country State Meet. He won every cross-country meet.
- 1963 Won NM State Division One 880-yard title.
- 1963 Ran the mile one time and broke the AHS record.
- 1963 Received a scholarship from the University of New Mexico (UNM) to compete in track and cross country.

College Accomplishments

- Lettered his freshmen and soph year at UNM in XC and twice in track and field.
- Was the fifth man on UNM's first WAC XC title in 1963 in Salt Lake City
- 1966 left track and field and cross-country due an Achillis tendon injury.
- Coached by Hugh Hackett, who is 1980 Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame Inductee.
- Competed in the mile, two-mile and steeplechase events.
- Was an all-time top 10 performer in the two-mile run.

Professional Accomplishments

- Duke City Dashers (DCD)
 - 1969 Summer after Tony's first year of teaching Physical Education (PE) at Montgomery Elementary School, Rex Clemmer gave up coaching the Duke City Dashers and turned over the small club to Tony. Coach Clemmer and Dan Dehart were the men who started DCD in 1968. Rex's daughter, Cheryl and others were planning to go to college away from Albuquerque. DCD competed with a small handful of girls that November at the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) Cross-Country Championships in Los Angeles. In December, Tony invited his former Lobo track teammates to merge into a "super club' but retaining the name Duke City Dashers. John Baker (1979 Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame Inductee), John Haaland, and Pat Cox were also Elementary PE teacher. They invited Elementary PE teacher, Jim Ciccarello (2010 Albuquerque/New Mexico Sports Hall of Fame Inductee) to join and DCD became a force in AAU competition. The DCD became a club to contend with, breaking record after record at meets throughout New Mexico and bordering states. The Dashers won many city, state, and national titles for at least a decade. Tony was instrumental in developing successful athletes during their formative years, several of whom continued to compete before, during and after college.

- o In 1970 DCD won three age group National Cross Country Champions in Cleveland, Ohio
- Three DCD athletes competed in the 1972 Olympic trials. Linda Stecker (800), Alice Watson (Long Jump and 200), Kathy Hart (high Jump).
- Coached Lynn Bjorklund, DCD's most accomplished runner, winning three AAU cross country championships and two AAU two-mile championships. Bjorklund was world ranked in the two mile/3000 meters in 1974 and 1975 and remained until it was broken in 2013 the national high school record holder for the 3000 meters race.
- NM Sports International Track Club was a small breakaway group of older athletes (Bjorklund, Vigil, Stecker, Bear and Lucero) from DCD that competed in the fall 1975 at the USA AAU cross country championships in Belmont. CA. Lynn Bjorklund won the individual title and qualified for the world cross-country championship in the winter of 1976. In June 1976 Susan Vigil won the USA Jr 800 and beat the Russian in the USA versus USSR junior meet.
- Advocated for Title IX and Intercollegiate Athletics Inclusion to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).
- Member of the NCAA Track & Field Rules committee 1981-1989.
- Interim Chairman NCAA Rules committee (Jan June) that merged men's and women's committee into one 1983.
- Member of the USA Olympic Long Distance Development Committee 1974 1982.

 tenure.
 - o 2008 NCAA Men's Track & Field championships, where they placed 22nd.
 - Developed an All-American in every event from 800 meters-10,000 meters, including the steeplechase for both men and women.
 - Over the course of his tenure, Sandoval has developed a host of All-Americans, national champions and Olympians.
 - o 2011 Produced a national champion in the decathlon (Mike Morrison)
 - Men finished in the top 25 for three consecutive seasons from 2009-11.
 - Coached David Torrence who holds the American record in the indoor 1000m with a time of 2:16.76.
 Torrence went on to run at the 2016 Rio Olympics where he took 15th in the 5000m.
 - Under his tutelage, members of the Cal women's team have had three NCAA winners in recent years:
 Alysia Johnson (800m, 2007), Kelechi Anyanwu (discus, 2007) and Katie Morgan (pole vault,
 2008). They have also earned All-America honors on 46 separate occasions. Chloe Jarvis earned indoor
 All-American honors in the 800 in 2005, while Erin Belger finished third in the 800 at the 2002 NCAA
 meet.
