

## CLARENCE ROBINSON

Clarence Robinson is one of only two men to ever win both long and triple jumps in the NCAA championships! His 26'9¼" long-jump record ranks ahead of even the immortal Jesse Owens's best of 26'8¼" . . . and his 52'8¼" triple jump at the 1965 WAC meet was an NCAA record.

Clarence participated in his two specialities under Coach Hugh Hackett at UNM, 1963-1966. He swept both events in the WAC championships three times. He doubled in the Kansas Relays and Drake Relays in 1965 . . . setting records in both of

these meets. His long jump of 26'9¼" still is a Drake record, and his name is in the Drake Relays Hall of Fame.

A two-time All-American, Clarence was a stellar performer on the UNM track team that was continually in the NCAA Top Ten lists of those years.

Who will ever forget the Lobo victory over USC when Clarence, Adolph Plummer, Dickie Howard, and John Baker led the Lobos to a 98½ to 45¾ win?
