

DANA MILLER-MACKIE

Dana Miller-Mackie, born and raised in Albuquerque, is a member of the Woman's International Bowling Congress Hall of Fame, as well as being named the Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame's Female Athlete of the Year in 1984 and 1992.

Dana, a well-rounded athlete, was a five-sport athlete, excelling in basketball, volleyball, softball, field hockey, and track & field at Sandia High School. Graduation placed her at the doorstep of UNM, where she became a Chapparal and also played basketball and field hockey, before graduating with two degrees in 1980.

She began her professional bowling career in 1981 and it didn't take long for her to start accruing titles. She won the U.S. Open in 1983 (St. Louis) and 1990 (Detroit), and has claimed 59 Professional Women Bowling Association titles, and 29 international titles. Dana has bowled 40 sanctioned 300 games; has 100 plus 700 sanctioned series, and her highest series has been 848. Adding to these impressive credentials, she has 6 sanctioned 800 series and has a tour average of 212.7 for 496 games in 1999. She has also averaged 200 or better for 19 consecutive years.

Dana and her husband, Steve, are owners of Ten Pins and More Bowling Center in Rio Rancho.
