His experience at the collegiate level included officiating high-profile games such as the **2013 BCS National Championship Game** and the **2015 Sugar Bowl**, which was a College Football Playoff semifinal.

NFL Career Highlights

Clark was hired by the NFL as a **field judge** in 2018. Following the retirement of veteran official Walt Anderson, Clark was promoted to the position of **referee**—or "white hat"—at the start of the 2020 NFL season.
